

With that being said, students are required to purchase their poly fill, batting, and fabrics for their projects. The FCS department provides a majority of the required supplies but due to student free choice over colors, designs, and such this will be their responsibility.

On average a project can cost between \$15-200 dollars depending on the student's chosen project. There are a variety of options to order fabric from. My recommendations are below:

- Quilts and More
- Ribbon and Rails
- Walmart (Not the greatest Quality)
- Enchanted Room (Glendive)
- Online Fabric Stores (Use Caution, but has BEST clothing fabric variety)

By signing this letter you acknowledge that this class will require students to make high purchases to complete projects. There may be instances where we have scrap fabric on hand to be used by students but there is no guarantee.
